COLLEGE GOAL SUNDAY is Sunday, February 23 at 2:00 pm at Ivy Tech Community College in Evansville. College Goal Sunday is a program that helps college-bound Indiana students, who qualify for undergraduate admission to a college or technical school in 2015, and their families to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Current Scholarship Information

Once you have been accepted to a college or university, please email the admissions office and ask if there are additional forms that have to be filled out for scholarships. Also, check the school's financial aid or scholarship web page for additional information.

Cassin-David Scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship for graduating seniors of any accredited Vanderburgh County high school with a **maximum** 3.4 cumulative grade point average (4.0 scale) planning to attend any accredited college, university, or technical/vocational school. The selection will be based on demonstrated moral character and integrity, willingness to work to overcome obstacles, and a desire to give back to the community. Thomas F. Walls Youth Hockey Scholarship is for eligible seniors who are graduating high school, participate in the Evansville Youth Hockey Association, have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.7 (on a 4.0 scale), and provided that the high school ranks its students, be in the top 20% of their graduating class. Applicants must be planning to pursue post-secondary education at any accredited college, university or technical/vocational school. The selection will be based on academic achievement, level of participation in the EYHA and/or other high school sports, and evidence of excellent character and leadership skills. If there are no qualified EYHA applicants, the scholarship may be made available to other graduating high school seniors who are involved in any sport. Greater Evansville USBCA Scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship for members of the Greater Evansville USBCA for two of the past four years, or their children, who have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average (4.0 scale) and attend high school in Posey, Vanderburgh, or Warrick counties. **Deadline: February 19, 2020.**

Jeremy A. Weil Memorial Art Scholarship is for graduating seniors of any Vanderburgh County high school who have completed a minimum of three full years of high school art classes and plan to enroll in art training at a college/university, vocational school, summer school/camp, or private lessons to be used for tuition, fees, or books. The selection will be based on the applicant's grade point average from his or her high school art classes, the number of art classes taken, and participation in juried or competitive shows resulting in recognition/awards. No school or community activities or work history unrelated to art will be considered. No school nomination or endorsement of an applicant is allowed. Legacy Scholarship is an annual scholarship created in 2010 by parents of students who were awarded the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship. Graduating high school seniors who have a minimum grade point average of 2.5 (4.0 scale), who are residents of Vanderburgh County, and who are planning to pursue post-secondary education at an accredited two- or four-year college or university in Indiana. *The recipient of the Legacy Scholarship must be a first-generation college student whose parents (the applicant's biological parents, adoptive parents, or legal guardians) have not attained a college degree (associate degree or higher).* Go to www.communityfoundationalliance.org/vanderburgh/scholarships/opportunities for more information.

Past recipients of the scholarship may also apply. Applicants must have a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average (4.0 scale) and demonstrated leadership skills. Russ Mason Memorial Golf Scholarship is for graduating seniors who are residents of Vanderburgh County or are graduating from an Evansville high school and who are planning to play college golf. The selection will be based on scholastic achievement, character, sportsmanship, leadership, golf ability, and the required essay. Mark Kniese is a nonrenewable scholarship. Student must be a camp counselor at YMCA Camp Carson in Princeton, IN, plan to pursue a postsecondary degree at an accredited university, demonstrate dedication and rapport with Camp Carson campers, and demonstrate YMCA's core values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility. West Side Nut Club Foundation (USI) Scholarship applications are now available in the main office. Students must have a GPA between 2.5 – 3.3 at the end of 7 semesters and plan to attend USI in the fall. The scholarship for \$2000 is renewable if a minimum 2.0 GPA is maintained. **Deadline: March 1, 2020.**

ETFCU Ted Hitch Scholarship - \$5,000 Either the applicant or the applicant's parents/guardians must have been members of ETFCU for at least one year by the March 3 scholarship application deadline. Use of services provided by ETFCU (ETFCU Financial Group and ET Shield) do not qualify as membership in the credit union. Applications will be accepted from graduating high school seniors planning to attend an accredited institution of higher learning as a full-time undergraduate student for at least the coming year. Applicants should have a minimum 3.75 GPA (without rounding up) on a 4.0 grading scale. Immediate relatives (children, stepchildren, grandchildren, nieces and nephews, brothers and sisters, and parents) of ETFCU officials, employees, and scholarship committee members are ineligible. **Deadline: March 1, 2020.**

Linda Maloy Education Scholarship is a \$5000 scholarship awarded to a student who has suffered the loss of a parent, parental figure, or immediate family member, or whose family is currently facing a health-related issue that has created emotional and/or financial hardship for the student and his/her family. Gill Orthodontics Scholarship Program

The Gill Orthodontics Scholarship Program awards two nonrenewable \$1000 scholarships annually with \$500 distributed each semester beginning in the fall. All scholarship money will go directly to the school to be applied towards tuition, books, fees, housing, or related expenses. Applicants must currently be in orthodontic treatment, or have completed orthodontic treatment by Dr. James Gill, D.D.S. All applicants must have a GPA of at least a 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, or a 3.75 on a 6.0 scale at the end of their senior fall semester for consideration of this scholarship. Evansville Home Economists Scholarship - This scholarship is presented each year to two outstanding senior students from area schools that plan to pursue a career in a field of Home Economics/Family and Consumer Science. Two scholarships will be awarded: one to a student pursuing a four-year bachelor's degree and one to a student pursuing a two-year associate degree. Each award recipient will receive \$250 per year, for a total of \$1000 for the four-year program, and \$500 for the two-year program, providing the student continues his/her study in the field and maintains a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or above. Applicants must have at least a 3.0 GPA. Applications are available in the main office. **Deadline: March 21, 2020.**

Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Scholarship is awarded to a deserving minority female student. Evansville Home Economists Scholarship - This scholarship is presented each year to two outstanding senior students from area schools that plan to pursue a career in a field of Home Economics/Family and Consumer Science. Two scholarships will be awarded: one to a student pursuing a four-year bachelor's degree and one to a student pursuing a two-year associate degree. Each award recipient will receive \$250 per year, for a total of \$1000 for the four-year program, and \$500 for the two-year program, providing the student continues his/her study in the field and maintains a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or above. If you are interested in playing sports in college, you will need to register with the NCAA Clearinghouse. Go to www.ncaaclearinghouse.net and click on Prospective Student Athletes. Choose the US Student Registration and follow the instructions.

******Attention Gentlemen******

Registering with Selective Service must be done within 30 days of your 18th birthday. What is Selective Service? This government agency's job is to provide untrained manpower for the Armed Forces if there is a national emergency. By registering, you add your name to the list of all the men in the nation, ages 18 –25. If you don't register, you are breaking the law. You also cannot qualify for federal student grants or loans for college, job training benefits, and many state and federal jobs. Go to www.sss.gov to register online.
